This year's 2017–18 California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) Post-Test Workshop Webcasts, presented by Educational Testing Service and WestEd in partnership with the California Department of Education, will be offered in two separate parts.

The first part, a **Principles of Scoring and Reporting** Webcast, will broadcast on Tuesday, May 22, 2018, from 1–2:30 p.m. This Webcast will include information about how the summative assessments are scored, what reports are available, and how to access those reports. Topics to be covered during the workshop will include the following:

- How to analyze and use the 2017–18 (and previous years') results to inform teaching and learning

- How to use data analysis protocol to improve teaching and learning. Discussion will include root cause examinations, review of past and current programs, and a look at policies, practices and procedures.

**The Results Are In—Now What? Analyzing Evidence to Inform Teaching and Learning** Webcast is open to everyone and requires no preregistration or logon account. However, it is highly recommended that remote viewers attend as a group,

as there will 20–30 minute blocks of time where participants will be instructed to interact and collaborate with colleagues. We encourage you to engage in this Webcast with curriculum, assessment, and instructional leaders, as well as professional development providers and other LEA or site representatives who might be expected to use the information and resources provided with other educators within the LEA.
