On Wednesday, September 30, 2020, from 1 to 3 p.m., Educational Testing Service (ETS), on behalf of the California Department of Education, will present a free, virtual training that provides guidance in assigning accessibility resources appropriately for the CAASPP and ELPAC. [Register now!](#)

The **Matching Accessibility Resources to Students' Needs** virtual training will focus on providing participants with an understanding of the importance of accessibility resources, the categories of accessibility resources, and the process for matching students with appropriate accessibility resources for daily instruction and on assessments.

Participants will learn how to categorize accessibility resources into Universal Design for Learning (UDL) categories. UDL provides a research-based framework for teachers to incorporate flexible materials, techniques, and strategies for delivering instruction, and for students to demonstrate their knowledge in a variety of ways. Participants also will learn how to use the new online [Individual Student Assessment Accessibility Profile \(ISAAP\) Tool](#) to select and assign resources to students for both the CAASPP and ELPAC assessments.

LEA CAASPP coordinators and LEA ELPAC coordinators are encouraged to attend and share this opportunity with staff who may benefit from this training, such as special education specialists, curriculum coordinators, or teachers on special assignment.

Materials will be emailed to registrants prior to training and will be posted on the [CAASPP 2020–21 Training Opportunities](#) and [ELPAC 2020–21 Training Opportunities](#) web pages. This virtual training also will be recorded and archived alongside the materials a week after the event.
