



Recruiting Educators for California Assessments!

ETS invites California educators to participate in scoring California assessments. They are the:

- California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP)
- Smarter Balanced Assessments for English Language Arts/ Literacy and Mathematics
- California Science Test (CAST), an online assessment based on the California Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS)
- English Language Proficiency Assessments for California (ELPAC), the current required state test that's given to students whose primary language is not English

This is an excellent opportunity for the state's educators to become more familiar with the new generation of California assessments. Educators who meet the criteria listed below are eligible to be constructed-response scoring professionals (Raters). They:

- Must have a bachelor's degree in any field
- Must be California educators with a current state teaching credential or employment verification from a California school
- Can be charter school teachers who may or may not have a teaching credential
- Can be retired educators and other administrative staff with a teaching credential who are currently not classroom teachers
- Must be a resident of California
- Can be bilingual/biliterate English/Spanish (these individuals are encouraged to apply)
- Can be raters who are interested in scoring for CAST (these individuals are encouraged, but not required to have teaching experience in science)

- Raters will score exams from their home or office using ETS's Online Network for Evaluation (ONE) system, work under the supervision of an assigned Scoring Leader and be required to successfully pass a certification exam prior to scoring.

Raters must submit their availability and are scheduled based on program needs. Scoring schedules are flexible and can include four-, six- and eight-hour weekday and/or weekend shifts.
